Cr Waters asked the following question to the City Building Surveyor with respect to an asbestos building that has been moved into Gretel Court, Two Rocks:

- Q1** What permits were issued before the structure was put there?
- Q2** What permits have been issued since the structure was put there?

The City Building Surveyor gave the following answer:

**A** A development approval has been issued for the development of a duplex on that particular property, no building licence has been issued.

Cr Waters then asked the following question:

**Q** As this dwelling is asbestos, I believe there should have been a licence from the Health Authorities from DOSHWA before they brought it down, is this correct and was there one issued?

The City Building Surveyor gave the following answer:

**A** The information from the Department of Local Government states with respect to asbestos regulations, that with the relocation of asbestos clad buildings, it is not necessary to receive the permission from the EDPH, I understand that is the Health Department, prior to transportation.

Cr Waters then asked the following question:

- Q** It also says in the Government Gazette on the use of asbestos cement sheet on item 7.1 A person who uses asbestos cements sheets commits an offence except when the person has prior written approval of the Executive Director of Public Health, was that given?

The City Building Surveyor gave the following notice:

- A** I would have to take that question on notice, I do not know whether that permission was given or not.

Cr Waters then asked the following question:

- Q** Could I also ask if the City Building Surveyor could have the building removed as soon as possible as no licences were issued, and that we also do something to make sure that this never, ever happens again in Wanneroo and that we consider the banning of these things within our City.

- A** Council could take action under Section 375 or 401 of the Local Government Act, which may lead to the removal of the building.

With respect to banning of these buildings, this is an issue that could be addressed as a Town Planning matter.

#### **ANNOUNCEMENTS BY THE MAYOR, WITHOUT DISCUSSION**

##### **WINTER CONCERT - WANNEROO CIVIC CENTRE**

An entertaining "Winter Concert" was held at the Wanneroo Civic Centre last Sunday.

The popular Ensemble Arcangelo performed a number of musical pieces for an enthusiastic audience that numbered 150. All in all the day was a big success.

##### **PRESENTATION OF CERTIFICATES - LEAP PROJECT, WHITFORD NODES**

Earlier this month I had the pleasure of presenting Certificates to the participants in the Council-run, Commonwealth-funded LEAP project at Whitford Nodes.

The six-month project gave the previously unemployed youths the opportunity to learn about conservation and put in place management plans for the environmentally-fragile coastal dunes in the district. A TAFE component was also incorporated into the

project and many of the participants now have better possibilities of gaining employment.

#### PIONEERS LUNCH

Council recently held a Pioneers Lunch to honour the district's pioneers and to admit five new members into that exclusive club of people who have lived 50 years or more of their adult life in Wanneroo.

Presentations of inscribed wooden plaques were presented to the five new Pioneers - Marija Parin, Perina Chokolich, Tony Parin, Joe Staltari and Kenneth Gibbs.

#### HISTORICAL ESSAY COMPETITION

At the same luncheon Council presented Mrs Glynis Monks with a special commendation award for her entry in the City's Historical Essay competition.

Mrs Monks' entry, entitled "Mission Farm", won her an award of \$250.

#### OFFICIAL OPENING - WANNEROO REPERTORY'S LIMELIGHT THEATRE

I recently had the pleasure of representing Council at the official opening of the Wanneroo Repertory's Limelight Theatre foyer area.

The new foyer adds a certain degree of sophistication to the theatre and stamps it as one of the best venues in Perth for the performing arts.

#### YOUTH SPEAK OUT FORUM

Last week Council hosted the Youth Speak Out Forum where a group of youth workers and business leaders met to discuss the problems confronting youth in this district.

The Forum went a long way towards addressing the concerns of the youth in gaining employment and other concerns.

#### LANDCARE AND ENVIRONMENT ACTION PROGRAMME

Next month Council will launch a new 26-week Landcare and Environment Action Programme.

Fifteen unemployed people aged between 15-20 years will be selected to work on the programme, which involves a public education and awareness campaign on the benefits of waste minimisation, recycling and composting.

##### **H90603 PETITION RESULTING FROM SPECIAL ELECTORS' MEETING - DEVELOPMENT OF MERRIWA, 31.05.93 - [325-32]**

A 449-signature petition has been received from residents of Merriwa requesting action in those terms expressed at the Special Electors' Meeting held on 31 May 1993, viz:

This petition authorises the Merriwa Development Committee to demand a full Legally acceptable statement from the Wanneroo City Council laying out the following:

- 1 A full itemised summary of rates received by Council from the residents of Merriwa to include all rates to the above mentioned Council for and behalf of the Developer and any other funds received by the Council directly or indirectly as a result of the Merriwa development.

- 2 Any land received by the Council - free of payment or by purchase from the developer.
- 3 A full itemised account of all expenditure to date in the suburb of Merriwa by the Council, since the beginning of development in the suburb of Merriwa.
- 4 The right to call for any independent audit (arranged by the Committee) if more than 50 letters are received by any member of the Committee (collectively) - voicing lack of satisfaction, in the Council's financial statement.
- 5 That the statement be forwarded to all ratepayers for their viewing and that 90 days be allowed for any objections to be lodged with the Committee members by residents concerning the "Statement".
- 6 That a vote of "no confidence" in the Wanneroo City Council shall be implied by each signature contained herein and shall remain until such time as a future meeting is called (within 120 days of the 16th of May 1993) to vote on the Council's response.

**MOVED** Cr Freame, **SECONDED** Cr Rundle that the petition from the residents of Merriwa be received and in view of the nature of the matters raised by the petition, this matter be referred to the Finance and Administrative Resources Committee.

A 4-signature petition has been received from residents of Greenwood requesting Council consideration of prohibiting parking in Coolibah Drive, Greenwood.

The petitioners advise that due to the close proximity of West Greenwood Primary School and the dropping off and collecting of children, they are having difficulty in maintaining respectable verge areas by way of damage to lawns and costly replacement of reticulation.

**H90605 PETITION REQUESTING INFORMATION REGARDING COURT DECISION**  
**- CITY OF WANNEROO VS MULLALOO TAVERN - [30/318]**

A 17-signature petition has been received from residents of Mullaloo requesting detail in respect of court proceedings initiated by Council against Tromen Pty Ltd, trading as the Mullaloo Tavern.

Council initiated the action for breach of a Pollution Abatement Notice on a technicality in the Notice, was not contested in accordance with the lawful requirements of current legislation.

The Notice was in compliance with the Noise Abatement (Neighbourhood Annoyance) Regulations.

As the proceedings were dismissed before the facts in the matter could be presented, Council has been ordered to pay total costs in the sum of \$535.00, inclusive of witness fees.

TOWN CLERK'S REPORT H50601

At the Special Meeting of Council held on 6 April 1993, Council considered Report H80401 - Panel of Inquiry into the City of Wanneroo. In response to that Report, Council resolved in part that "4 the Policy relating to Expenses etc be referred to the Policy and Resources Committee for further consideration;".

The Town Clerk presents comment in respect of the development of the current policy and related matters.

He suggests an addition to the existing policy to provide for the submission of claims on a regular basis, ie monthly, and for the forfeiture of allowable expenses where claims for reimbursement are not received within three months of the expenditure being incurred.

**MOVED** Cr Freame, **SECONDED** Cr Rundle that Council:

- 1 amends Policy A2-06 "Members of Council - Travelling and Other Expenses" to include the following:

"Members electing to receive reimbursement of expenses in accordance with the provisions of this policy shall submit the appropriate claim form, together with supporting documentation, within two months of those expenses being incurred. Expenses not claimed within two months of being incurred or falling due shall be deemed forfeited";

- 2 adopts the following as policy and amends its Policy Manual accordingly:

"Loss of Earnings

Where a member necessarily incurs expense or loss of earnings in or in consequence of travelling to or attending a meeting or a committee of the Council, or as a delegate of the Council at a meeting or a committee of a regional Council, Council shall pay to the member the amount of the expenses and

- (a) where the loss of earnings so incurred is less than \$50, the amount of the loss; or
- (b) where the amount of the loss of earnings exceeds \$50 or cannot be accurately certified, \$50.

All claims made pursuant to this policy shall be accompanied by appropriate supporting documentation."

- 3 includes suitable acquittance requirements relating to the payment of expenses/Superannuation Guarantee Levy as part of the City's Policy and Procedure.

**H50602 FLYING OF ABORIGINAL FLAGS - [301-3]**

DEPUTY TOWN CLERK'S REPORT H50602

At its meeting on 28 October 1992 (Item G91027 refers), Council resolved that a report be submitted to Policy and Resources Committee for consideration of flying the Aboriginal flag with the Wanneroo Council flag and the Australian flag."

The Deputy Town Clerk outlines the protocol associated with such a proposal, together with costs and options for consideration.

- 3 purchases an aboriginal flag.

At its meeting on 23 September 1992 (Item G90927 refers), Council resolved that a report be submitted to the Policy and Resources Committee on whether the use of the mayoral allowance should be accountable to Council.

The Deputy Town Clerk presents an overview of current practice at some metropolitan local authorities and considers the merit of amending the practice presently followed at the City of Wanneroo.

He advises that as to the question of accountability, it is neither required nor considered practicable for the mayor to document all expenditure in the same manner as Councillors, primarily because his representation expenses are markedly different.

Cr Major declared an interest in this item.

**H50604 ATTENDANCE OF PARLIAMENTARIANS AT CITIZENSHIP CEREMONIES -**  
**[703-1]**

The Deputy Town Clerk reports on the desirability and practicality of inviting local Parliamentarians to attend citizenship ceremonies conducted at the Joondalup Administration Centre. He advises that over the years, standard practice has been to extend invitations to all local Members to attend the larger, external ceremonies.

The Deputy Town Clerk suggests that although attendance by a large contingent of Parliamentarians would reduce the seating available for participants, families and friends, it is considered unlikely that a significant number would attend and accordingly he sees no problem in extending invitations to also attend the smaller ceremonies, as it would serve to reinforce the dignity and importance of the occasion.

He submits a suggested policy for adoption into Council's Policy Manual.

Deputy Town Clerk's Report H50604 recommended that Council adopts the following as Policy and amends its Policy Manual accordingly:

#### ATTENDANCE OF PARLIAMENTARIANS AT CITIZENSHIP CEREMONIES

Local Members of State and Federal Parliament shall be invited to attend Citizenship Ceremonies conducted by the City of Wanneroo on behalf of the Department of Immigration, Local Government and Ethnic Affairs, provided only that such invitations shall not be extended in the period between the calling and conduct of either a State or Federal election.

#### **H50604A ATTENDANCE OF PARLIAMENTARIANS AT CITIZENSHIP CEREMONIES - [703-1]**

**MOVED** Cr Freame, **SECONDED** Cr Rundle that as Local Members of State and Federal Parliament may attend Citizenship Ceremonies conducted by the City of Wanneroo on behalf of the Department of Immigration, Local Government and Ethnic Affairs in a personal capacity, invitations are not deemed necessary.

**H50607 SCOUT AND GUIDE HALLS - CONTRIBUTION TO OPERATING COSTS - [210-2]**

CITY BUILDING SURVEYOR'S REPORT H50607

At its meeting in September 1991 (Item F50910 refers), Council resolved to provide a report on the feasibility of community groups carrying out minor maintenance and cleaning duties as a contribution towards the operating costs of Council Buildings.

The City Building Surveyor outlines the types of Council buildings utilised by Community Groups and the current practice with regard to maintenance. He advises on the problems associated with Community Groups becoming responsible for maintenance as well as the risks involved with exposure to public liability.

Accordingly, Council should endeavour to balance the perceived risk and cost with the responsibilities it places on users. ### PETITIONS AND DEPUTATIONS

#### DEPUTATION - POULTRY MANURE

Messrs N Trandos, B Williams and D Miliopoulos representing the Market Gardeners' Association addressed the Committee concerning the possible banning of the use of natural poultry manure as a fertiliser for market gardens, in favour of pelletised fertilisers to alleviate the fly breeding problems.

Mr Trandos advised that the natural poultry manure was not only the best fertiliser for the growing of vegetables in Wanneroo's sandy soils but was readily available and cheap. If market gardeners were required to use pelletised fertilisers, the price would be prohibitive and the cost of producing good quality vegetables would double. Many of the vegetables grown in Wanneroo are exported and it is essential to keep prices down in order to be competitive.

Mr Williams advised that it was possible to prevent the breeding of flies in stock piles of poultry manure if the manure was kept dry and covered with black plastic for a minimum of 10 days. He believed that some market gardeners could do more to control the fly breeding problems in stock piles of manure although it was more difficult where manure was spread into furrows for the growing of particular vegetables.

Mr Trandos does not support the prosecution of market gardeners with regard to fly breeding and suggests that Council sets up a working party and invites representatives from vegetables, strawberry and flower growers, horse owners, Agriculture Protection Board officers and Council staff to look into the problems associated with fly breeding and eradication in the City of Wanneroo.

Following questions from Councillors, the Chairman thanked the deputation for addressing the Committee and advised that the matter would be considered later in the meeting - Item H40632 refers.

"SUBDIVISION OF RURAL ZONED LAND

Preamble

In considering applications for the subdivision of rural zoned land, Council shall have regard to the following provisions. Council's policy on the subdivision of rural zoned land does not preclude the creation of Special Rural Zones within its area of application. However, all proposals for the creation of Special Rural Zones need to be progressed in accordance with normal town planning processes.

## Policy Provisions

- 1 In rural zoned lands north of Flynn Drive, Neerabup, Council shall only support subdivision where each lot yielded by the proposed subdivision contains a minimum area of twenty (20) hectares (ha), except in the Spearwood sand unit of the Spearwood Dune system as defined in CSIRO Land Resources Management Series No 5 (Landforms and Soils of the Perth Metropolitan North West Corridor by W M McArthur and G M Bartle), refer to Plan 1, where each lot yielded by the proposed subdivision shall contain a minimum area of four (4) ha.
- 2 In rural zoned lands south of Flynn Drive, Neerabup, Council shall only support subdivision where each lot yielded by the proposed subdivision contains a minimum area of four (4) ha.
- 3 Every effort shall be made to ensure the continued availability for extraction of the limestone resources within rural zoned land. Subdivision shall not be supported in areas defined by Council as containing important limestone resources (shown as limestone areas on Plan 1) if the subdivision is considered likely to lead to the unavailability of the limestone resource for extraction.
- 4 In all rural zoned areas, Council shall support subdivision only where each lot yielded by the proposed subdivision contains a flood secure area (to accommodate dwellings and other structures) of a minimum of one thousand (1,000) square metres (m<sup>2</sup>), and an accessway to the flood secure area, at a Reduced Level (RL) to Australian Height Datum (AHD) specified by Council.
- 5 Within the 20 ha minimum lot size policy area, flood secure areas and accessways shall be naturally occurring as a result of natural topographic elevation, but may also be created by the placement of clean filling material if a naturally occurring flood secure area and/or accessway does not exist.
- 6 Within the 4 ha minimum lot size policy area, flood secure areas and accessways shall be naturally occurring as a result of natural topographic elevation.
- 7 Where natural flood secure areas and accessways can be identified, the subdivider shall identify such areas and accessways on the plan of subdivision.

- 8       Where the placement of clean filling material is necessary to create flood secure areas and accessways, the subdivider shall be responsible for creating these areas and/or accessways and they shall be created at the time of subdivision.
- 9       The placement of clean filling material to create flood secure areas and/or accessways on lots created by the subdivision of rural zoned land constitutes development and therefore requires Council's prior approval."

The subject sites are situated at the intersections of the freeway reserve and Hodges Drive and Shenton Avenue. The new zones will be Residential Development, Joondalup City Centre and Service Industrial.

In February (Item H20249 refers) Council considered a subdivision application for the Connolly site for a total of 21 residential lots ranging in size from 680m<sup>2</sup> to 1,140 m<sup>2</sup>. This application has been pending the outcome of discussions with concerned residents and LandCorp and consideration of submissions received in relation to the Scheme Amendment.

The City Planner reports that at the close of advertising for Amendment No 593, 70 submissions were received. Sixty-five objections to the rezoning of the Connolly site and five to the Heathridge site. No submission was received regarding the other sites associated with the amendment.

He gives an analysis of submissions received and lists the major reasons of objection.

Residents of Littorina Avenue, Heathridge, have petitioned Council seeking the installation of traffic control devices in the vicinity of the entrance to Eddystone Primary School.

H10620 SOUTH AUSTRALIAN CONTAINER DEPOSIT LEGISLATION POLICY -

CITY ENGINEER'S REPORT H10620

The Container Deposit Legislation (CDL) was introduced in South Australia in 1975 and is popular with the residents of S.A. and strongly opposed by organisations representing national and multi-national beverage companies.

The debate in Australia on CDL has mainly addressed its effectiveness for roadside litter reduction. Claims that CDL is an expensive and not particularly effective way to reduce roadside litter appear to be justified.

A major argument against CDL is that it collects most of the glass and aluminium containers. These form the major income for kerbside collection programmes and their viability is reduced when there is less glass and aluminium to collect.

The introduction of CDL on beverage containers based on the S.A. model would warrant a major review of the current kerbside collection programmes being developed in Western Australia.

The City Engineer reports that now the Swan Brewery is stopping the use of refillable bottles it is likely to result in refillable bottles totally disappearing in the near future.

**MOVED** Cr Marwick, **SECONDED** Cr Cooper that consideration of the City Engineer's Report H10620 in relation to the South Australian Container Deposit Legislation Policy be deferred and referred back to the Technical Services Committee.

**CITY ENGINEER'S REPORT H10621**

Council has requested information on the cost and feasibility of mulching garden waste in the City of Wanneroo. Mindarie Regional Council is also considering the issue of composting green waste in its evaluation of secondary waste treatment processes.

The City Engineer provides details of the costs associated with the operation and mulching of "greens" at a site such as Badgerup Road Tip, the current market value and demand for shredded green waste and for compost.

He reports that several metropolitan Councils mulch green waste at their tip sites and use various methods to exchange mulch for green waste.

A number of meetings were held to examine the desirability of skating facilities and the merits of low cost development in various locations. It was established that the need for a skate park was confirmed and the site at Craigie Region Open Space was the preferred location.

The working party presents the results of its studies which led to the conclusion that one facility should be provided at a site at the rear of the existing outdoor facility of Craigie Reserve to enable cross usage of recreation activities, toilets and kiosks.

The working party presents details of the costs, proposed layout, building and management considerations, fee structure, hours of operation and funding arrangements and advises that \$185,000 has been carried forward from the 1991-92 Budget. A further \$126,500 would be required in the 1993/94 Budget to cover the shortfall if the project is to proceed.

RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- 1 does not proceed with the establishment of a skate park at Craigie Leisure Centre;
- 2 continues to examine alternative low cost skate board facilities in various park locations in the City.

H90623 REPORT ON ATTENDANCE AT THE 1993 NATIONAL CONGRESS OF THE  
INSTITUTE OF MUNICIPAL MANAGEMENT - [309-3]

In company with the Deputy Mayor, Cr Peter Nosow, I attended the 1993 National Congress of the Institute of Municipal Management at the National Convention Centre, Canberra from 16 - 19 (incl) May 1993.

The theme of the Congress was "Partnerships - Pathways to the Future".

The Congress was opened by the Hon Bill Hayden, Governor General of Australia who made the point that over the past two decades, peoples' expectations from local government and the need for municipal managers to respond properly to those demands, have grown considerably especially in the areas of general community service and amenities; also that as the year 2000 approaches, the demand for the types of services people expect from local government and the quality of that service delivery is only likely to increase.

However, given the current economic and revenue constraints, if those expectations are to be met, it will only be through local councils forming partnerships and on many fronts, such as with State and Federal Governments, the media, sporting and recreational facilities, developers, national and regional associations, resource sharing groups, local business and industry and not the least, by forming partnerships with groups and individuals within the local government area.

The keynote address delivered by the Hon Gough Whitlam AC QC was titled - "The necessity of Partnership for Australia's Future".

This address, in my view, revisited the early 1970's when it was suggested Australia's future would be best served by only two levels of government - national and regional governments (local).

He agreed to a proposition that State Governments were remnants of Australia's colonial past and supported regionalisation. He also said it was hard to identify any functions which could be better fulfilled by any of the present States than by a national government or by regional local governments.

The "Process of Partnerships" in the United Kingdom presented by Mr Roger Paine CEO Cardiff City Council gave an insight into present-day local government in that country.

He said partners can build something that individuals cannot do on their own which brings benefits otherwise unattainable. He spoke of internal partnerships within Council; the trust and sharing of purpose between elected members and staff; partnerships with other public sector bodies and with the voluntary sector organisations.

A most significant comment was that Councils in Britain were now required to compete on the open market through the tendering process for all of the services etc it provided. With the extension of the Common Market, he gave an example of a French firm tendering for the collection and disposal of garbage in Cardiff, Wales.

Alderman Peter Woods, President of the Australian Local Government Association talked about Partnerships between the spheres of

Government and left no doubt as to his support for a National Government and Regional Local Governments.

Some of the points with which he concluded were -

An effective partnership between spheres of Government is essential to the future well being and progress of Australia.

The two essential perspectives of Government in Australia are National Government and Local Government.

On the professional side of Government strategies must be looked at for developing a better understanding and closer relationship between Commonwealth Bureaucrats and Local Government professionals.

Councils must meet in Canberra for an Annual Congress of local government to form the foundations for progressing a new partnership between the National and Local spheres of Government.

A range of speakers addressed the theme of the Congress under the following -

- Partnerships with the community
- Successful partnerships
- Partnerships with the Private Sector
- The Role of Local Government in Partnerships
- Partnerships with the Industrial Sector
- Partnerships with the Media
- Partnerships with Business
- Partnerships - Servicing the Community Needs

Heather Neil, Executive Director of the Western Sydney Regional Organisation of Councils Ltd (or WSROC) spoke on "Regional Co-operation".

WSROC represents the nine (9) local government areas of Baulkham Hills, Blacktown, Blue Mountains, Fairfield, Hawkesbury, Holroyd, Parramatta and Penrith as well as Prospect Electricity.

The population of the WSROC (1991) was 1.1 million or 1/3 of Sydney's population and covers a land area close to half that of the Sydney metropolitan area.

WSROC was originally established in 1973 under the Commonwealth Grants Commission legislation and could not have existed without the co-operation and partnerships between Councils.

WSROC operates under a number of levels - the decision making body is a board with two voting delegates from each Council. Each Council makes an equal annual contribution to the operating costs. There are three (3) Policy Committees and ten (10) professional Committees.

Heather Noel said the essence of WSROC's approach is achievement through shared vision, common commitment and communication. It acts as a peak organisation able to represent the combined views

of its members, both inside and outside the region. It also acts as an initiator, co-ordinator and facilitator.

She submitted that WSROC has succeeded in the past and will continue to succeed in the future because of the participatory, united and co-operative effort of its member Councils.

Clearly, in my view, the overwhelming proposition coming out of the Congress and the direction being taken in the Eastern States, was that local government's future lay in regionalisation and more particularly in its relationship with the National Government.

Accordingly, I would therefore suggest that consideration be given to convening an informal meeting say between the Lord Mayor of Perth, the Mayors of Stirling and Wanneroo (or their nominees) together with the CEO's to discuss the general question of co-operation between the three authorities and see if there is any support for an extension of the activities of the Mindarie Regional Council into other appropriate activities of local government.

**H90624** REPORT BY CR NOSOW ON ATTENDANCE AT THE 1993 NATIONAL CONGRESS OF THE INSTITUTE OF MUNICIPAL MANAGEMENT - [309-3]

Cr Nosow submitted the following report:

The 1993 National Congress of the Institute of Municipal Management was held at the National Convention Centre Canberra from 16 to 19 May 1993. I was given the opportunity to attend in my capacity as Deputy Mayor and I thank Council in enabling me to attend this all important forum of Australian Local Government Professionals.

The theme of this years' Congress was "Partnerships - Pathways to the Future". The speakers presented various items all exploring the different partnerships available both within and external to the industry we call Local Government. Partnerships which open up new opportunities and those that will be forced upon us as we tackle the challenges and rapid changes that are taking place within society, to meet the increased expectations and growing complexities as we approach the 21st Century.

One of the recurring themes of the Congress was the National Centenary and the Republican debate along with the need to address the relationship between the three spheres of Government in the overall context of this debate.

A number of speakers spoke strongly about the relevance of State Governments and advocated investigating a new system of Federal and Regional Governments in conjunction with the Republic debate. The more notable of these being the Hon Gough Whitlam and Alderman Peter Woods who unreservedly espoused the view that State Governments were "Remnants of Australia's Colonial Past" and questioned whether State Governments were appropriate for the task of managing Australia in the modern world. The Federal Minister for Local Government, Mr Brian Howe, has recently echoed these sentiments during a speech he delivered at the Local Government Ministers' meeting held in Launceston on Friday, 7 June 1993.

Undoubtedly the topic of partnerships between the spheres of Government has emerged in the context of a nation undergoing profound change, world economies are changing and Australia is caught up in the process. Words such as Deregulation, rationalisation, corporatisation, mission statement, privatisation, user pays, cost recovery, accountability etc are all part of the changing scene and along with this tide of change maybe it is appropriate at this point in time, as this congress has done, to question the relevance of State Governments, their duplication of function and resultant inefficiency within the three tiered system.

Examples given of where the current system has broken down were, "Three recent reports have highlighted the failure of Australian Federalism to address the problems of urban sprawl and under servicing at the urban fringe" and "State planning policies in the 1990s are seeking to promote urban consolidation in and around the centre of Australia's major cities while State transport policies still encourage urban sprawl through the construction of new freeways and major roadways".

In the context of partnerships we had explored the importance of partnerships between Councillors and Council officers, Council and the community, Council and business, Council and Government and between Local Authorities themselves.

It was stressed that the efficient running of a municipality depends on an effective partnership between and recognition in respect of the different roles played by the Council, a Councillor and the officers employed to serve that Council. Hand in hand with this was the stated need that:

"The Council in conjunction with its officers needs to set clear corporate objectives and the strategies for achieving the objectives. Finalisation of a corporate plan will provide a solid base for Council policy development and decision making and the provision for those plans for public scrutiny will give the community a clearer view of the Council's activities and directions."

Resource Sharing and Community Development are integral to the process of partnerships.

Resource sharing between Councils, Council and Government, Council and the community etc, is an effective means to stretch municipalities abilities to serve their communities and merits a place in any Councils' corporate or strategic plan. It is an indicator of efficient management performance.

Partnerships by Council with the community leads to a process of Community Development and is one of the major issues to be addressed by Local Government. It is essentially about citizens engaging in a co-operative self help process to achieve a wide variety of community improvements. Councils need to adopt strategies to foster maximum community participation in addressing local problems. We also need to break through petty jealousies and self interest groups which are a by-product of community activities and look at the big picture. The betterment of the community at large.

Partnerships then, are an association for the purpose of achieving some object more effectively and efficiently than it could be achieved by oneself.

Partnerships have shared risks and shared benefits and are principally based on "trust". They should operate to the benefit of all persons involved and is not simply a case of one party dictating a result or conclusion to the other. Partnerships have a commonality of purpose and rely upon a willingness to take risks in order to grow, and the ability to commit to a course for the future and to stick with it.

It is evident that partnerships in Local Government will become more frequent and for many an almost economic necessity. The Republican debate will ultimately lead to a more rigorous examination of the 3-tier system of Government. This will put more and more pressure on all levels of Government to "add value" on top of a list of "extra" demands the community will continue to exert.

In today's changing world there is nothing more certain than uncertainty. We, in Local Government, need to be in a position to capture the benefits of change and not become a by-product of its consequences. Partnerships appear to be a part of that reality.

From time to time over a number of years the question of the "need" for a community radio station in Wanneroo has been raised informally in various discussions both within and outside Council.

I am very strongly of the view that a community radio station within the City's boundaries would be an extremely worthwhile medium and service for the community within the municipality.

I am aware that there currently exists a number of community radio stations in the metropolitan area. In particular, community stations have operated successfully in Fremantle and Rockingham since the late 1980's.

### **H90632 HEPBURN HEIGHTS PUBLIC OPEN SPACE DRAFT MANAGEMENT PLAN - [740-89894]**

## INTRODUCTION

Alan Tingay and Associates has prepared the Hepburn Heights Public Open Space Draft Management Plan. The Draft Plan is open for public comment until 30 June 1993 and has been made available for public inspection at Council's offices. A copy of the Report has been placed in the Councillors' reading room.

In 1992 the Hepburn Heights Public Open Space Management Committee was formed to provide assistance for the short and long-term management of the Open Space. The Management Plan was commissioned by the Committee to provide a structure upon which the future management of the Open Space could be based. The location of the Hepburn Heights public open space is shown in Attachment No 1.

## SUMMARY OF THE DRAFT MANAGEMENT PLAN.

The Open Space contains good quality examples of Banksia Woodland, limestone heath and Jarrah Woodland vegetation types and has been set aside for the purposes of flora and fauna conservation. The Open Space bushland, together with the adjoining Pinnaroo Valley Memorial Park bushland will also provide a useful passive recreational and educational opportunity for the expanding local population and for local school children.

The Management Plan recommends that the management objectives for the Open Space will best be achieved with an 'A' Class Reserve classification and vesting in the National Parks and Nature Conservation Authority (NPNCA). Management would then be carried out by the Department of Conservation and Land Management (CALM).

The Plan outlines the objectives for management and recommends tasks to be undertaken to fulfil these objectives. Of particular importance is the need for adequate fencing, controlled access, fire management, rehabilitation, weed control and fauna management.

The area will be fenced to deter random access into the bushland. Strategic controlled access gates have been sited to direct passive recreation to semi-formalised tracks upgraded and completed in crushed limestone. These tracks and other sand tracks will form a network of firebreaks around and through the bushland to help control the spread of any bush fires.

Surplus tracks and cleared areas will be rehabilitated and weed control measures will be undertaken to maintain the good condition of the vegetation.

The native fauna of the Open Space will be protected as much as possible by instituting measures to control the number of cats, foxes and rabbits. The wildlife corridor between Hepburn Heights and Pinnaroo bushland will be maintained by appropriate fencing and openings to permit the passage of terrestrial fauna.

The Hepburn Heights Public Open Space Management Plan encourages the involvement of the public in all aspects of management so that the bushland is most likely to retain its environmental value while also satisfying its recreational and educational objectives.

The draft management plan shows the sites for the proposed SECWA substation and the fire station on Hepburn Avenue, within the open space area. This accords with the proposed revised development plan for Hepburn Heights submitted by LandCorp and considered by Council last month (item H20629). The SECWA substation issue was dealt with at length in Report No H20629 and Council resolved to write to the Hon Minister for Lands to obtain advice on this

issue, as well as that of the fire station site. It would be appropriate that these issues be resolved to Council's satisfaction prior to it giving its total support to the draft management plan as it currently stands.

- 2 it supports the proposal that Hepburn Heights Public Open Space be vested in National Parks and Nature Conservation Authority as an 'A' Class Reserve.

  - (b) a partnership involving the Wanneroo City Council or one or more private enterprises;
  - (c) none of the above, but a suitable alternative;
- 2 a report be submitted to Town Planning Committee on the results of the above study.

**H90642 BY-LAWS RELATING TO DOGS - BYLAW D2: DOG KENNELS - [920-14]**

The Town Clerk advised that recent legal advice suggests that Clause 5(a) of By-law D2 - Dog Kennels, viz:

- "(5) A person shall not erect or keep a kennel establishment:
- (a) on any land that is not situated within the area described in the First Schedule to these By-laws, and";

may be invalid and that the question of location of dog kennels was properly a land use matter and should therefore be considered in accordance with the provisions of Town Planning Scheme No 1.

Scheme No 1 provides a use class Veterinary Establishment (Animal Hospital, Kennel, Cats' Home) which is an "AA" or discretionary use designation.

The Town Clerk outlined the particular circumstances relating to a Kennel licence situated at Lot 29 (8) Hawkins Road, Jandabup, which is now a matter of an Originating Summons in the Supreme Court of Western Australia.

The current kennel licence on this property was to expire on 27 July 1993, but in view of the legal advice now received in respect of Clause 5(a) could not be renewed.

Having regard to the provisions of Town Planning Scheme No 1 Clause (a) of the by-law should therefore be repealed; also as the original licence was initially issued many years ago it should be renewed.

**MOVED** Cr Cooper, **SECONDED** Cr Marwick that:

1 Council:

- (a) adopts the proposed Amendments to its By-laws Relating to Dog Kennels as attached to the June Council Minutes;
- (b) authorises the affixation of the Common Seal to and endorses the signing of the documents;
- (c) authorises administrative action in accordance with Section 190 of the Local Government Act 1960, to have the proposed By-laws promulgated;
