#### **Memorial Proposal**

Robert Harwood reported that there are a significant number of young people within the Padbury area who would like to erect a plaque in memory of Adam Quigley who passed away last year. A letter has been received from Lisa Jorge, a year 12 student at Padbury Senior High School, on behalf of the year 12 students and other friends of Adam. There are no details in the letter as to the circumstances surrounding Adam's death. The letter details a proposal to erect the plaque in a park in the area and it is intended that the costs would be covered entirely by their fundraising activities. They are seeking approval from City of Joondalup to place a memorial to Adam Quigley in a local park and would like the Youth Advisory Council to record its support in its minutes.
