## **BUSINESS ARISING**

- **Election of Chairperson**

- **Visit to Parliament House**

- **Millenium event / Y2K**

Members to access the discussion forum on the Office of Youth Affairs (Youth  
Advisory Council) website to keep informed of the progress of the millenium  
event. Meeting times are posted on this site.

Discussion followed about the creation of a website for young people attached to  
the City of Joondalup.

Jeremy Manning advised that the City of Joondalup is developing a new website  
and that it is intended that a youth page will be an integral part. New website will  
be launched in the New Year.

Members may attend the Millenium event meetings in the New Year.

- **Honorariums**

The required details will be sent to the Office of Youth Affairs within the next  
week. Once these details have been processed the payments will be made.

- **Young people in Public Space**

Jeremy Manning outlined some events that have led to the issue being referred to the Youth Advisory Councils.

The City of Joondalup is keen to take a leadership role in resolving the problem.

Discussion comments included :

- Young people are stereotyped according to their clothes and harassed due to the fact that they often congregate in groups.
- Young people are often “moved on” continually but rarely have anywhere to end up.
- In many situations, public spaces are purposely not set up to accommodate the needs of young people because people are scared that they may attract the negative minority of the youth population.
- Often feel that they are “bouncing off walls”.

Hillarys and Whitfords identified as current “Hotspots”

Discussion followed about the definition of loitering.

Jeremy Manning outlined some current initiatives that are being piloted in other areas including Fremantle.

Need to improve the way that young people are perceived within the youth community.

**Members resolved to continue to informally research the issue**

- **Extreme Expo**

Planning committee meeting was held at Craigie Leisure centre and ten young people attended.

It was a very successful meeting

Promotion strategy has been developed

Discussion included the type of stalls that would be present

Music lineup is being developed

Discussion followed about ways of involving more young people in the planning and running of the event.

Jeremy Manning asked for contact details of individuals or groups who might want to be involved in the event for example bands, DJ's , stalls.

Megan to find a number of a friend who may do a DJ workshop

**Action : – Megan Smolders**

Budget is currently \$ 10000 for the event although there are some options for external funding.

- **Coast care**

Have been invited to attend the Mullaloo Coast Care group meeting to explore some options for the involvement of YACs in their activities.

Jeremy Manning asked for volunteers

Phillipa Brown volunteered and will attend the meeting with Jeremy Manning.

- **Music Club**

Jeremy Manning outlined the current proposal and asked if any members were interested in taking part in the steering committee.

John Saratsis volunteered to be a part of the committee

- **Regular Music Concerts – Actions - Megan Smolders / John Saratsis**

John Saratsis mentioned that he had spoken to friends about being involved in the Extreme Expo

John Saratsis will give contact details to Jeremy Manning

Some other possible acts were put forward

**Members to get contact details for Jeremy Manning so he can speak to them.**

Purpose is to get a strong positive reaction from Extreme Expo then continue the concept in the community

Tim Lee mentioned that it may be worth talking to RTR FM about supporting the event.

- **The Great Debate**

Aman Pabla reported that the City of Joondalup is organising a Great Debate for Wednesday 8 December. The topic will be that “Computers make old people redundant” Aman Pabla and Natasha Newman will represent the younger team and the opposing team will hopefully comprise of “older” people.

### **Ocean Reef Residents Association**

Aman Pabla is currently attending the meetings of the Ocean Reef Residents Association.

A current topic of discussion is the provision of hardstand basketball courts in a number of parks. The two proposed parks were Mirror and Santiago Parks. The Joondalup North Youth Advisory Council was asked to consider the subject and to record a resolution in their minutes.

Jeremy Manning discussed the need to properly discuss and research the proposal before making a resolution as we do become accountable for the decision that we make – They should be informed decisions.

Members discussed the pro’s and con’s of each park including issues of access, equipment and lighting.

Members supported the proposal in principal and suggested that Mirror Park was definitely a better option due to better lighting, access, and character.

Members resolved to research the proposal further before next meeting.

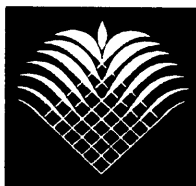
