- **YAC website / Photo / Information**

- **Mirror Park – Map development**

- **Councillor involvement in Youth Advisory Council**

Jeremy Manning reported that councillors had expressed a desire to have greater involvement in the Youth Advisory Council and asked members to discuss the best possible way for this to occur.

Members suggested that the first meeting should be an informal meeting such as a dinner. Following that event, elected members could be invited to attend meetings on a roster basis.

- **Road Safety Launch**

Jeremy Manning reported that he had attended the launch with John Saratsis and outlined the purpose of the grant scheme.

Members discussed a number of projects that could be submitted for funding.

The issues that members identified as contributing to teenage road trauma included:

1. Vehicle unroadworthiness
2. Peer pressure leading to speeding, recklessness, driver fatigue, driving under influence
3. Not wearing Seat Belts

Members resolved that they would like to cooperate with the Joondalup South Youth Advisory Council to address the second issue - Peer Pressure.

Members suggested that the best way to do this could be by developing a locally specific video featuring young drivers that could be shown at local schools and in local cinemas.

Jeremy Manning will submit funding submission and find some contact details for media students to help with the project.

- **Youth Rally Team**

Jeremy Manning reported that the City of Joondalup had been approached to cooperate with the City of Wanneroo to set up a Youth Rally Team in the northern region. Substantial funding including provision of a consultant, part-time Team Manager, vehicle and workshop equipment is being offered by the Office of Youth Affairs. The Rally Team would consist of up to thirty young people. Jeremy Manning asked members to consider some ways of expanding the project to enable more young people to be directly or indirectly involved. Suggestions included:

- Linking involvement to driver education courses
- Outsourcing some project tasks such as promotion, uniforms, multimedia to schools in the region.

- **Youth Council Week**

Jeremy Manning reported that planning for this is underway and suggested that more frequent meetings may be necessary to ensure adequate preparation for the event.

- **New members for Youth Advisory Council**

Options for distributing and promoting Youth Advisory Council nominations were discussed.

Nomination forms were handed out to be distributed to interested friends.
