BUSINESS ARISING

1. Youth Rally Team

Jeremy Manning reported that the Office of Youth Affairs had informed the City of Joondalup that they were required to advertise for tenders for the Youth Rally team. This is contrary to all previous information and would mean the tender process would not be finalized until mid September. Staff members decided that it would be very difficult to recruit and train a rally team in this timeframe and recommended that we withdraw from the project. This was also the view of Wanneroo Youth staff. However, staff of both Cities would be enthusiastic to present a joint tender for the project in the future. The tender should be advertised during September and will be a fourteen month project culminating at Rally Australia 2001.

2. Logo / letterhead for Youth Advisory Council

Members discussed a need to develop an awareness of the Youth Advisory Council and its role in the community. Jeremy Manning suggested that the Youth Advisory Council needed to develop a recognisable identity in the form of a logo. He suggested that members attempt to design a logo before next meeting. Members discussed the requirements of the logo and asked if an electronic copy of the City of Joondalup logo can be forwarded to them to be incorporated. Jeremy Manning highlighted that the logo could be refined by City of Joondalup graphics section and would need to be approved by management.

3. Road Safety Project

Jeremy Manning suggested that the Youth Advisory Council elect three members to represent the Youth Advisory Council on a steering group for this project.

5. Financial Awareness project

Jeremy Manning reported that Community Services Staff were developing a project to promote financial awareness amongst young people. Discussion focussed on the type of information that young people need to know, the availability of similar information through schools and some possible formats to present the information.

Conclusions included

- Program should include basic information such as bank account information, using cheques, telephone/Internet banking etc.
- A young person should present program. This could be a person who has been in financial trouble or a successful young businessperson as a motivational speaker.
- Program could be conducted through schools as a part of personal development classes.
- Program should include sample budgets and role-playing scenarios using fake money.

6. Local Government Week Youth Survey – Craigie Skate competition

This project is currently being reviewed. Jeremy Manning mentioned that there might be an opportunity to include regular information/contact details for the Youth Advisory Council on the Youth Information Page. Members resolved to provide content for the Youth Infopage at the Youth Advisory Council meeting approximately one month prior to publishing of the page. Jayne Miller volunteered to coordinate this to occur

9. Meeting Training

The Joondalup Youth Advisory Councils have been offered training in meeting procedures at no cost through Leadership WA.
