Council at its meeting on 14 March 2000 (CJ049-03/00 refers) resolved:

"(That Council)

- 1. PROCEEDS with the overall Urban Design Study and the pilot precinct projects at Mullaloo Beach and The Parade shopping area, Sorrento, as detailed in Report CJ049-03/00;
- 2. AUTHORISES expenditure from budget items D844 (Urban Design Consultants Identify Centres) and D853 (Urban Design Consultants Precinct Plans) to undertake the studies referred to in (1) above;
- 3. INVITES all interested groups to participate in a study or such meetings which may take place".

Council at its meeting on 19 December 2000 (CJ385-12/00 refers) resolved:

"(That Council)

- 1. 1 NOTES the Draft Concept and the proposed public consultation program;
- 2. 2 THANKS the focus group members for their valuable input".

Council at its meeting on 22 May 2001 (CJ159-05/01 refers) resolved:

- 1. redrafted by taking into account all the concerns raised in the submissions received from the public;
- 2. resubmitted to the community, and local interest groups for further review and consultation;
- 3. resubmitted to Council for review.

Council at its meeting on 11 September 2001 (CJ315-09/01 refers) resolved:

"(That Council)

- 1. RESCINDS its resolution CJ159-05/01 of 22 May 2001, being:
 - "that the draft Mullaloo Concept Plan be:

 1. redrafted by taking into account all the concerns raised in the submissions received from the public;
 - 2. resubmitted to the community, and local interest groups for further review and consultation;
 - 3. resubmitted to Council for review."
- 2. NOTES the submissions received regarding the Mullaloo Concept Plan;
- 3. NOTES the significant public concern expressed regarding the proposed overspill parking in areas either side of Northshore Drive;
- 4. NOTES that there are a number of unresolved issues relating to the Council owned lots located to the west of Merrifield Place;

- 5. NOTES that the Mullaloo Concept Plan, modified by the deletion of the elements noted in 3 and 4 above, be used as a basis for further design, costing and evaluation, and for discussion purposes regarding the ongoing development of the area;
- 6. REQUIRES a further report detailing relative priorities, indicative costings and phasing of the elements in the Mullaloo Concept Plan paying specific attention to the points raised by detailed consultation with key community groups and others, particularly the need to ensure that there is no reduction in the recreational functionality and nett area of the useable surface of Tom Simpson Park proper".

Council at its meeting on 26 February 2002 (CJ16-02/02 refers) was presented with a petition requesting a special meeting of electors and resolved:

"(That Council)

...requesting that a Special Meeting of Electors be held in relation to Tom Simpson Park, Mullaloo; be received and referred to the appropriate Business Units for action".

It should be noted that the special electors meeting referred to above was held on 18 March 2002.

Council at its meeting on 12 March 2002 (CJ29-03/02 refers) resolved:

Council at its meeting on 21 May 2002 (CJ118-05/02 refers) resolved:

- 2. Council at its meeting on 11 June 2002 (CJ79-06/02 refers) resolved:

"That Council)

RESCINDS its decisions of 21 May 2002 (Item CJ118-05/02 refers) being:

- ESTABLISHES a Working Group comprising five elected members and up to 10 concerned residents to consider and make appropriate recommendations to come back to Council regarding the issues raised at the Mullaloo, Kingsley and Greenwood Special Meetings of Electors and report back with recommendations to Council.
- APPOINTS the following elected members to the working group to consider the concerns of electors arising from the special meetings of electors:

NOTES that the revised preliminary Concept plan on public exhibition replaces the former Mullaloo Beach Concept Plan and ensures that there is no relocation of the central car park to the grassed area and no additional car park on the grassed area. Additionally, resolves to include the grassed area currently on the unused road reserve into Tom Simpson Park proper.

CONSIDERS submissions received regarding the Mullaloo Beach Concept Plan, and determines whether the plan or any key elements thereof should be deleted if they are considered not to have clear or demonstrable community support or tangible planning benefits;

CONSIDERS the concerns expressed by the electors, with particular reference to any consideration given for the alienation of reserves, and the development of the draft Preservation of Public Reserves Policy.

NOTES the concerns mentioned, and considers the specific requests for improvements to services and facilities in the park area when considering the Mullaloo Concept Plan issue, and the composition of the 2002-03 budget.

TAKES NO ACTION regarding the status or disposal of Lots 7 to 11, 29 to 32, and 35 Merrifield Place, Mullaloo UNTIL it has considered matters relating to:

- Public consultation;
- the stability of the land;
- the effect any development would have on natural beach processes;
- the legal position in relation to the status of the land;
- the environmental/conservation value of the land;
- · community attitudes regarding the land; and
- the impact of any decision on the City's assets and operations;
- the Joint Commissioners' determination on the valuation placed on these lots;
- the merits of having the land included as part of the adjoining "Bush Forever" site.

INVESTIGATES the options available for receiving benefit in return for the reservation of the ten lots it owns in Merrifield Place, Mullaloo, including but not limited to a land swap with Bush Plan land located adjacent to the Ocean Reef small boat harbour.

NOTES that surf club access for boats and emergency services, the heliport evacuation area and disabled parking facility close to the beach ARE PROVIDED FOR in the Mullaloo Beach

CONSIDERS the electors' motion regarding requested limitations on the height and other aspects of the tavern redevelopment proposal as a component of its deliberation on that Development Application when that application comes before Council for its consideration.

NOTES the intention to include the public in the development of the proposed new public consultation strategy and/or guidelines (by calling for expressions of interest) to workshop ideas that would assist policy and guideline development, and INCLUDES further opportunity for public feedback, by incorporating a 60 day public consultation and advertising phase in the project schedule to allow for better public review and scrutiny of draft policy/guidelines.

NOTES the request by the electors to conduct an independent inquiry into the precinct planning project but AGREES that as a result of the actions highlighted within Report CJ118-05/02 such an inquiry is not warranted.

RESOLVES to improve the parks and reserves in the locality of the Mullaloo Beach area by providing suitable playground equipment for pre-school children, upgrading the children's playground, provide shade over the equipment, installing better lighting and barbeques and upgrading all toilet facilities.
