Dear Mr. Catchpole,

<u>Proposal to install a Telecommunications facility at Hillarys shopping</u> <u>centre (Flinders Ave)</u>

As local residents, we would like to raise our concerns regarding this installation.

I understand from Hutchison that the facility (2 antenna 4.8metres above the supermarket roof) will "blend into the area!" and it is classed as low impact. Please find attached a medical summary which states that this may not be the case.

As the centre will be frequented by many people, (retailers and customers) I feel that there may be Health and Safety concerns. Perhaps not now but in the future.

Also, the centre is in an established residential area and many houses will be in direct vision of this facility. I know that many of these homes have not been notified by Hutchison.

Just for your information we know of several residents <u>very close</u> to the site who have not been informed. How many residents have Hutchison notified?

Finally, there are several facilities already in Hillarys and Padbury. Is it not possible to share an established location such as Hillarys Light house or Whitfords Nodes?
