<p>A 1,058 signature petition has been received from residents of the City of Joondalup requesting that Council engage with, and where appropriate, initiate proceedings against the owners of the Ocean Reef Shopping Centre to address the state of its disrepair.</p> <p>RPC02757</p>	<p>15 September 2015</p>	<p>Completed</p>	<p><u>Update as at November 2015</u></p> <p>The City met with the owner's representatives in November advising them of the petition and requesting action to address the concerns of the petition.</p> <p>The City will continue to liaise with the owner regarding the site and keep the lead petitioner informed of progress. This petition will remain outstanding and continue to be reported to Elected Members until a satisfactory resolution is achieved.</p> <p><u>Update as at February 2016</u></p> <p>A meeting is scheduled with the new property owner in early March 2016 to obtain an update on where the property development is currently at.</p> <p><u>Update as at May 2016</u></p> <p>A number of meetings have been held with the managing agents and owners of the property on different occasions to discuss concerns about the state of the centre and to try and ascertain what the owners' future development intentions and associated timeframes are. At these meetings the City has made it clear it has a strong expectation that something needs to happen on this site in the short term and that the City will do what it reasonably can to assist in expediting this process.</p>

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			<p>Unfortunately the City cannot compel the land owner to redevelop the site. The City has recently been informed by the managing agent that the land owner is currently in the process of preparing plans for the redevelopment of the centre. At this stage it is not clear what the scope of the redevelopment will be and whether it will involve the demolition of the old service station building on the site.</p> <p>The lead petitioner has been advised.</p>
<p>A 34 signature petition has been received from residents of the City of Joondalup requesting that Council approves the expansion of the Poynter Farmers Market to include an additional 10 market stalls, one community stall and five market stalls for special occasions such as Christmas, Mothers Day and the market anniversary.</p> <p>RPC02837</p>	15 December 2015	Outstanding	<p><u>Update as at February 2016</u></p> <p>The City is currently assessing the development application and it is anticipated that a report will be presented to Council at its 19 April 2016 meeting.</p> <p><u>Update as at May 2016</u></p> <p>The City is continuing to assess the development application and liaise with the applicant.
