

Proposal for Consideration:

<u>'KINGSLEY COMMEMORATIVE PEACE PRECINCT'</u> (Lot 971, 52 Creaney Drive, Kingsley)

PROJECT AIM:

'To provide the residents of Kingsley and surrounding suburbs, with a place of tranquillity and quiet contemplation within a beautifully preserved natural bushland setting'

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

To value-add by transforming the area currently known as Lot 971 Kingsley - at no or minimal cost to the City of Joondalup - into a Commemorative Peace Precinct by way of a new name, wheelchair and pram-friendly pathways and some bench seating, and with the erection of 5 commemorative plinths in designated areas within the precinct.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION - THE SITE:

Lot 971, 52 Creaney Drive Kingsley is a 10,000sqm buffer of remnant bushland between the Kingsley football oval and the Kingsley Shopping and Commercial Centre and Tavern.

It was ceded to the City by the original developers of Kingsley and is zoned 'Civic and Cultural'

In the Joondalup Council meeting of June 2014, Council voted to accept a petition from 1,977 Residents to not sell the land for development.

Since then the members of the local community and the Kingsley and Greenwood Residents Association (KAGRA Inc) have in a voluntary capacity or 'caretaker role', held quarterly work days to collect rubbish from the area.

The City has since fenced off three separate tree-stand areas to protect the biodiversity of the bushland after native orchids were found in a flora survey. More recently the work days have become 'weeding days' and KAGRA Members have just planted 120 seedlings and mulched the fenced areas with the assistance of the City.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION - THE CONCEPT:

Brian F Cooper OAM JP is an ex-military man of 40 years service in total and at present an active JP serving on 3 rosters. Amongst other things he has been a Veterans Advocate for 35-40 years, currently Chairman of Trustees of the Poppy Day Trust Fund, and has also been Secretary of several ex-service Associations in years past with tenures exceeding 20 years duration.

The original concept was born from approaches to him over the last two Anzac Days at the local tavern. Due to the ageing demographic of the citizens of the suburbs of Kingsley, Woodvale and Greenwood, these people have difficulty in attending the traditional Anzac and Remembrance Day Ceremonies in the major venues in the metropolitan area.

With that in mind it was thought that a local, more accessible memorial where they are able to pay their respects in quiet contemplation in a rural bushland setting would be advantageous for the community.

It is further thought from discussions with Lions and Veterans services, that this project, by way of example could see Joondalup set the standard and be the first of many of its type across Perth - in suburbs with similar demographics - especially on this centenary year of the ANZACs

Further discussion has since expanded the project to recognise and celebrate our multicultural community and to be a place of refection for the community at large, to commemorate the injuries and loss of life in Maritime, Airborne, Natural and Man-made Disasters

STAKEHOLDERS AND INVOLVED PARTIES:

The KAGRA Committee were contacted by, and have agreed to support Mr Brian Cooper OAM with his Peace Precinct proposal

Mr Cooper also has spoken separately with, and has the support of both Andrea Mitchell MLA, and the Lions Club (Kingsley Woodvale) both of whom have also agreed to assist with the project and have been instrumental with the plans thus far.

Other potential stakeholders that this project may affect as listed below have been spoken to and to date several met by Mr Cooper and given their support in principle to the project:

The Creaney Primary School The Kingsley Junior Football Club The Kingsley Amateur Football Club (Seniors) The Kingsley Woodvale Cricket Club The Kingsley Woodvale Junior Cricket Club Greenwood Secondary College (letter of support included herewith) The Kingsley Tavern IGA & Numerous tenants (Business Owners) of the Kingsley Shopping Centre The Ward Councillors

It must be noted at this point that the word 'Memorial' will not be referenced (in any final naming decisions) out of respect for the Kingsley Football Club Bali Bombing Memorial situated within the Kingsley clubrooms.

This project is devoid of any involvement from any RSL body; albeit Mr Cooper has spoken with and has their support for the project.

There is scope for the precinct to be incorporated into an educational interactive experience for the local schools; in particular the nearby Creaney Primary School. As you will note in the letter of support (see appendices) from the Principle of Greenwood College, he is keen for the schools involvement into the future. It is hoped and indeed expected that a meeting with the Principle of Woodvale Secondary College in the near future will be met with the same enthusiasm.

And finally, the City of Joondalup as the landowner and therefore the main shareholder, will benefit as ultimately this project is about further improving a valuable green space and making it a landmark - a place of quiet contemplation, peace and tranquillity in our busy world - for the wellbeing of its local community and ratepayers.

It is expected that the financial outlay to the city of Joondalup may be negligible and in fact optional, due to the grants available, as detailed herein.

No trees or vegetation will be removed for this project and any structures will complement the existing space and not impinge on the current regular maintenance schedule of the City's parks and gardens staff

PROJECT DETAIL AND COSTINGS:

See appendices at the end of this document for the *proposed* locations, sizes and designs of these plinths, information on pathways all of which are open to the expert recommendation by the City Officers.

The larger of the 5 Commemorative plinths will be dedicated to wars and conflicts in which Australia and its Allies have been involved since the Boer War in 1901 up until the present day and it is hoped would include three flagpoles and a plinth.

The FULL COST of this main commemorative plinth will be covered by the Department of Veterans Affairs under their Major Projects Grant - verbal approval has been given from Canberra, <u>pending Council Approval</u> of the project.

The 4 smaller but no less significant plinths will be to commemorate the injuries and loss of life in Maritime, Airborne, Natural and Manmade Disasters that have occurred form 1901 up until the present day.

These plinths will be placed so as not to interfere in any way with the usual regular city maintenance of the area (ride-on mowers etc)

Quotes obtained for these smaller plinths with plaques are less than \$2000 (two thousand dollars) each installed

The cost of these secondary plinths and plaques are expected to be covered in full by LotteryWest Grants, Bendigo Bank Community Grants, Various Veteran Grants, The Lions Club have offered donations including potential access to their International Fund, plus other various fundraising activities have been discussed if required

The proposed pathways would connect the carpark to the South of the site (at the back of the tavern), through the lot between the tree stands - to connect with the existing main pathway that surrounds the ovals so the precinct is accessible for wheelchairs and prams.

CUSTODIANSHIP / CARE AND MAINTENANCE:

The Kingsley and Greenwood Residents Association (KAGRA Inc) will continue to act as caretaker for the area with regular workdays in the bushland, and together with the Lions and DFWA are prepared to look after the Precinct and ask the City for Custodianship to do so.

It is also thought that the local Primary Schools could be encouraged to be involved as part of their curriculum, to take 'ownership' for an area of such great value environmentally and historically.

PROPOSAL AIM - WHAT WE ARE REQUESTING:

The objective of this Proposal is to supply information which will show the benefits of this project to the community at large, the City of Joondalup and Elected Members, leading to a favourable report recommending approval.










KINGSLEY PARK SITE MAP
