

NAIDOC Week Celebrations

NAIDOC Week is an annual national celebration of the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians. Each July, to coincide with this and in recognition of their significance, the City of Joondalup hosts a month-long program of activities highlighting Australian Indigenous cultures.

NAIDOC stands for the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Day Observance Committee. Its origins may be traced to the emergence of Aboriginal groups in the 1920s that sought to increase awareness in the wider community of the status and treatment of Indigenous Australians. To learn more about Indigenous culture, be sure to participate in the City's month long NAIDOC program in 2019, themed Voice, Treaty, Truth.

Each year the City appoints a Musical Director to conduct the community choir along with a band of professional musicians to accompany them. The choir comes together to rehearse for approximately eight weeks leading to a final performance at the Joondalup Festival. Twilight Lantern Parade

Watched by a crowd of over 10,000 people as the sun sets, every year the parade gets bigger and better.

One of the highlights of the Festival is the Twilight Lantern Parade, a participative community arts project involving over 1,500 local school children, artists and community groups. As the sun sets, the festival site is transformed by beautiful illuminated lanterns.

The project is open to all members of the community and participation is sought from schools both primary and secondary, community groups, professional artists and volunteers. There are many ways to get involved with the Twilight Lantern Parade and each year the project offers a variety of ways to participate, through workshops, artist-in-residence programs, volunteering and much more.

The Valentine's Concert is the City of Joondalup's premier music event featuring entertainment from renowned Australian performers on the picturesque grounds of the Joondalup Resort.



The annual City of Joondalup Invitation Art Prize takes place in October at the Westfield Whitford City Shopping City and exhibits the work of up to 30 invited professional Western Australian artists, providing the Joondalup Community with access to thought provoking contemporary artworks. During the Exhibition the City provides a public education program to inform and develop understanding of visual arts practices, including artist floor talks, masterclasses, forums and workshops.

Art Collection

The City's Art Collection comprises over 260 artworks and is regarded as one of the State's best collections of contemporary Western Australian art. Amongst its highlights are artworks by Indigenous artists such as Julie Dowling and Shane Pickett, and by a significant number of senior Western Australian practitioners including William Boissevain O.B.E., Hans Arkeveld and Eveline Kotai.

Additionally, the City's collection includes artworks by artists who live in, or are connected to, the City of Joondalup, in addition to others who have captured its familiar sights.

One significant group of artworks within the collection are those that have been acquired through the City's Invitation Art Prize as winners of the overall prize each year. This unique group represents the best of Western Australian contemporary visual art practice over the last two decades.




The Collection is on display in the City of Joondalup's facilities, including the Civic and Administration buildings, Libraries and Leisure Centres. Public access to the collection is facilitated through the rotation of artworks through these venues.

Public Art

Public art is an artistic work that is created and located for public accessibility. The defining principle of public art is that the work has been designed by an artist for enhancement of a public realm. Public art can be of any art form from traditional media such as sculpture, to contemporary works or functional objects and multimedia installations. It may be a permanent or temporary artwork or ephemeral art and has a broad scope with many possibilities for the form, function, materials and degree of permanency of the artwork.

The City's current Public Art Collection includes 36 works including mosaics, murals, sculptures, street bollards, architectural details and street furniture. Much of works are in and around the Joondalup City Centre.



To guide the delivery of public art projects that contribute to creating a sense of place, promote the expression of local identity, and reflect on the shared values of the community, the City adopted a Public Art Policy on all refurbishments of City-owned properties or new developments where the overall project costs are over \$1,000,000.

Artist-in-Residence Program

The Artist-in-Residence Program involves the City hosting a visual artist from interstate or overseas for a period so that they may produce a new artistic work and forge connections with the local community. It provides the City with an opportunity to view the local area through the fresh eyes of a visitor and their creative responses. During their stay, the artist researches a commissioned artwork for the Art Collection based on their sustained engagement and experiences with the City's social, urban or environmental attributes.



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Introduction

In achieving this vision, the City recognises the importance of attracting and supporting events that deliver economic benefit to the local economy and contribute to a vibrant and dynamic community atmosphere.

The City is invested in supporting community wellbeing through the provision of free or low cost events for the community. Through support for external organisations and community groups, the City strives to promote vibrancy, create interest and foster a positive lifestyle and community.

In supporting these outcomes and to advance the City's vision, the City's Sponsorship, Contributions and Donations Program aims to achieve the following objectives:

- Attracting, hosting or supporting a wide range of events, programs and activities that enhance the liveability of the City for the community and promote Joondalup as a destination for visitors to the region;
- Providing positive exposure for the City's brand and image locally and regionally;
- Providing support to local organisations/community groups/sporting clubs;
- Stimulating economic development and providing benefits to local businesses;
- Increasing visitors to the region;
- Creating long-term value to the City and its residents by building sustainable partnerships or relationships; and
- Ensuring that all agreements entered into provide an adequate return on investment by overseeing and managing the sponsorship, contributions and donations program, process and outcomes.

The City of Joondalup has a strategic vision to become a bold, creative and prosperous City on the global stage.

The Sponsorship, Contributions and Donations Program provides support for external organisations/community groups in four categories:

- Donations;
- Corporate Sponsorship;
- Event Sponsorship; and
- Corporate Contributions.

Support through the City's Sponsorship, Contributions and Donations Program must meet all eligibility and criteria listed within this application pack.

In addition to the Sponsorship, Contributions and Donations Program, the City also offers alternative funding through the Community Funding Program, Sports and Recreation Funding and Arts and Cultural Grants. More information on these alternative funding programs can be found at joondalup.wa.gov.au

This application pack provides information on the types of support offered through the City's Sponsorship, Contributions and Donations Program.

If you have an event, program or activity that will directly benefit the City, please read this application thoroughly or for further information on how the City can assist you contact the City's Marketing Coordinator on **9400 4424**.



Criteria

Applications for City sponsorship, contributions or donations need to satisfactorily address the following criteria before being considered by the City:

- The applicant, event, program and/or activity must be aligned with the City's strategic direction.
- The event, program or activity must be consistent with the City's Sponsorship, Contributions and Donations objectives.
- The audience for the event, program or activity should reach one or more of the City's target markets.
- Requests for sponsorship, contributions and donations should be for an event, program or activity located within the City of Joondalup district and which provides a significant return to the general and/or business community. *
- Tangible benefits for the City, its residents and/or local businesses need to be associated and demonstrated with the event, program or activity.
- The event, program or activity must demonstrate positive exposure for the City and its corporate brand and image.
- The event, program or activity should provide opportunity to create long-term value to the City, residents and/or businesses.

* The City will only consider sponsorship or donation agreements located outside the City if the sponsorship provides clear benefits to the residents of the City and/or an opportunity to market the City to a relevant target market outside of the City's boundaries.

Exclusions

The City will not enter into an agreement or provide donations for events, programs or activities that involve:

- Illegal activities
- Tobacco
- Adult-related industries
- Racist organisations
- Controversial or divisive organisations/projects
- Political organisations or political activities
- Religious activities, in whole or in part, for the purpose of furthering religious doctrine
- Companies or projects seeking City approval or endorsement (such as forthcoming land development application)
- A conflict with the values of the City
- Harm towards the environment
- Benefit an individual, person or family
- An organisation that has previously shown unsatisfactory management of donations or sponsorship received or has presented unsatisfactory or incomplete reporting.

Organisations are also ineligible for the sponsorship, contributions and donations program if the application is for:

- an organisation that has previously submitted, and been successful, with an application for sponsorship, contribution or donation within the same financial year.
- an organisation, event, program or activity that has received financial support through another funding program from the City within the same financial year
- an organisation, event, program or activity that has already occurred or will occur during the four month time frame required for the sponsorship giving and donations assessment process to occur
- the total cost of the event, program or activity
- general business operating expenses
- capital expenditure
- costs already being covered by another sponsor or government body
- event, program or activity occurring outside of the City's boundaries *.

* The City will only consider sponsorship agreements located outside the City if the sponsorship provides clear benefits to the residents of the City and/or an opportunity to market the City to a relevant target market outside of the City's boundaries.

Category Eligibility

1. Donations

Donations by the City reflect its commitment to improve the wellbeing of the City of Joondalup community. Due to the philanthropic nature of donations, the City does not seek a direct return or benefit from a donation. The City does however give preference to organisations/community groups that provide a direct benefit to the City's residents or businesses or provide/improve a service for visitors to the region.

The range of service areas considered for donations may include organisations that provide:

- home support services for the aged or persons with disabilities
- community information and support services
- youth and children services
- multicultural services
- services to the disadvantaged
- emergency relief services

Whilst the City does not seek a direct return or opportunity to market its brand, organisations are required to acknowledge the contribution made by the City.

Organisations eligible to apply include:

- community based not-for-profit organisations
- charitable organisations or organisations with charitable objectives

Applicants seeking a donation from the City must be an association incorporated in accordance with the *Associations Incorporations Act 1987*.

Funding is available as a cash donation, in-kind donation or a combination of both.

Sponsorship

The City provides sponsorship support for events, programs and activities that provide opportunity for the City to:

- receive positive exposure for its brand and corporate image to its desired target markets; and
- receive an adequate return on investment or benefit for the level of support provided.

In this regard the City's sponsorship is split into two areas; corporate sponsorship and event sponsorship.

2. Corporate sponsorship

The City offers corporate sponsorship to organisations/groups/clubs that enhance the City's image and contribute to creating a vibrant and engaging community.

The range of activities which may be considered for corporate sponsorship include:

- awards and presentations that acknowledge excellence in relevant professional fields
- support for activities which enhance community service within the region
- conferences held within the region
- promotional activities and materials that provide positive exposure for the City and could potentially increase visitors to the region and contribute towards stimulating economic development

Applications considered suitable for corporate sponsorship include events, programs or activities that support:

- students and professionals
- local businesses
- community information
- tourism
- economic development
- seniors
- young people
- children

- multiculturalism

Organisations eligible to apply include:

- community groups
- not-for-profit organisations
- educational institutions
- commercial/corporate organisations

3. Event sponsorship

The City's Events Sponsorship provides a financial contribution to assist organisations or community groups to deliver free or low cost events within the City's boundaries.

Such events include:

- sporting or recreation events that encourage community participation
- cultural or community events that provide free or low cost activities or performances for the community
- carnivals, festivals or fairs held within the City

Examples of areas that would be considered for sponsorship include events that support:

- arts and cultural development
- health and fitness
- family entertainment
- multiculturalism
- seniors
- young people
- children

Organisations eligible to apply include, but are not limited to:

- arts and cultural organisations
- community groups
- not-for-profit organisations
- educational institutions
- commercial/corporate organisations

4. Corporate Contributions

The City is committed to supporting groups, clubs and organisations that deliver or provide assistance with sporting and community services.

Corporate contributions provide financial assistance to local sporting clubs or community groups who provide an essential community service within the City, or require assistance with the costs associated with hosting their club/group within the City.

The range of services that may be considered for corporate contributions may include:

- Assistance with venue hire and turf maintenance fees of sporting clubs that compete at an elite level located within Joondalup
- Volunteer organisations who provide an essential community service within the City

Organisations eligible to apply include, but are not limited to:

- Local not-for-profit sporting organisations
- Local volunteer organisations

Examples of areas that would be considered for corporate contributions include:

- Sport and recreation
- Emergency service
- Community service
- Community development

IMPORTANT: All corporate contribution applications should be discussed with the City's Coordinator, Recreation Services on **9400 4922** prior to submitting the application.

Funding is available for each category as a cash sponsorship, in-kind sponsorship or a combination of both.



Benefit Guide for Sponsorship Requests

Corporate and Event Sponsorship must provide tangible benefits for the City and the local community. The following represents common sponsorship benefits and is provided as a guide for the application form.

- Logo on event, program or activity signage
- Recognition on media releases
- Recognition and link on social media forums
- Logo on regional advertising
- Digital marketing e.g. Inclusion in club newsletters, emails, on hold messages
- Exclusive rights
- Economic development e.g. opportunity for local businesses to get involved and benefit
- Tourism e.g. increase visitors to the region, people will travel to attend the event program
- Corporate hospitality e.g. complimentary VIP tickets, invitation to event launch/finale
- Opportunity to include advertisement in publication or program
- Recognition on radio advertising
- Naming rights to the event, program or activity
- Logo on state/national advertising

Application deadlines

The City's sponsorship, contributions and donation program is open all year round for organisations to submit their applications.

All applications need to be submitted at least four months prior to the event, program or activity being held.

This can be done at any time throughout the financial year.

Late applications

Applications that don't allow enough time for assessment and processing will be returned to the applicant without assessment.

Application process

Applications can be made at any time throughout the financial year. Applications that are received early in the financial year and ahead of time are more likely to receive support as funding will more likely be available.

All applications need to be submitted in the prescribed form and at least four months prior to the event, program or activity being held. Applications that do not allow enough time for assessment and processing, or that are incomplete will be returned to the applicant without assessment and will not be considered.



Assessment

The success of an application is determined by:

- its merits against the eligibility, criteria and objectives outlined within this application pack; and
- competition from other submissions or existing sponsorship giving or donation agreements.

All requests for sponsorship, contributions and donations are assessed and approved by the Chief Executive Officer, on a case by case basis, and subject to sufficient funds being available in the City's annual budget.

In assessing requests for sponsorship, contributions and donations, whether that is cash, in-kind or a combination of both, the full cost of the request (including the calculated value of any in-kind component) will be considered as part of the total amount.

Use of City venues

Events, programs or activities that require the use of a City facility, park or reserve are required to submit a separate event application form. Please contact the City's Community Facilities Booking Office for further information:

Successful applications

Donations

All applicants will receive notification from the City following the assessment of the donation application.

Successful applicants will be notified in writing outlining the details of the donation and will also be requested to send a tax invoice to the City for the donation amount. The City will not process any donation payments until an invoice is received.

Corporate and event sponsorship

All applicants will be notified in writing following the assessment of the sponsorship application. Successful applicants will be required to complete, sign and return two copies of the sponsorship agreement. The City will then sign both copies, retain one for its records and return the second copy to the applicant.

Payment of sponsorship

The City will pay 70% of the agreed sponsorship amount on signing of the sponsorship agreement. Successful applicants should send through an invoice for 70% of the agreed sponsorship amount with the signed agreement.

The remaining 30% will be paid post event and once the City has received the required acquittal form. Please ensure you send this invoice with your final acquittal documentation.

Please ensure that all invoices are tax invoices including GST. Organisations that are not registered for GST need to clearly indicate this on their invoice and DO NOT include GST in the invoiced amount.

Use of the City's logo

Sponsorship agreements are likely to require the City's logo to be displayed on promotional materials or other items relating to the event, program or activity. The City's Marketing Coordinator can be contacted on **9400 4424** to gain access to an authorised version of the City's logo and the guidelines on its use.

All materials that display the City's logo are required to be sent to the City's Marketing Coordinator for approval prior to production.

Delivery of benefits

Please liaise with the City's Marketing Coordinator on **9400 4424** regarding the delivery of ALL benefits outlined in the sponsorship agreement.

You will need to ensure that you allow enough time for the City to coordinate any support that is required.

NOTE: All communication regarding sponsorship agreements is to be through the City's Marketing Coordinator.

Change of event, program or activity details

Once sponsorship of an event, program or activity is approved the applicant cannot make significant changes to the event, program or activity without discussions and approval from the City.

Please liaise with the City's Marketing Coordinator on **9400 4424** regarding any changes as significant changes are required to be put in writing and will need to be approved by the Chief Executive Officer for the sponsorship agreement to continue.

Acquittal

All events, programs or activities that are sponsored by the City require a full acquittal to be completed within two months of the event, program or activity being completed.

Please complete all sections of the City's Sponsorship Acquittal Form.

Your final 30% invoice will not be processed until all acquittal details have been met.

The City's Marketing Coordinator will contact you with any queries regarding your acquittal.

If all acquittal information is satisfactory, payment will be processed and you will receive a confirmation letter from the City finalising your sponsorship agreement.

Future sponsorship

Upon completion of a single year sponsorship agreement that does not include an option for renewal, the organisation must reapply to be considered for future sponsorship.

Please note that your event, program or activity will not be funded on the basis that it was supported in previous years.

The City endeavours to ensure the sponsorship process is fair and equitable to all. Your application will be assessed against the eligibility and criteria outlined previously in these guidelines and competition from other applications or existing sponsorship agreements in the relevant financial year.



Please do not rely on the City providing sponsorship on an ongoing basis.

The City accepts multi-year sponsorship applications where the agreement term does not exceed three years.

Corporate Contributions

All applicants will be notified in writing following the assessment of the contribution application. Successful applicants will be required to complete, sign and return two copies of the contribution agreement. The City will then sign both copies, retain one for its records and return the second copy to the applicant.

Payment of contribution

The City will pay 100% of the agreed contribution amount on signing of the contribution agreement. Successful applicants should send through an invoice with the signed agreement.

Please ensure that all invoices are tax invoices including GST. Organisations that are not registered for GST need to clearly indicate this on their invoice and DO NOT include GST in the invoiced amount.

Use of the City's logo

Contribution agreements are likely to require the City's logo to be displayed on club apparel or other items relating to the organisation or program. The City's Marketing Coordinator can be contacted on **9400 4424** to gain access to an authorised version of the City's logo and the guidelines on its use.

All materials that display the City's logo are required to be sent to the City's Marketing Coordinator for approval prior to production.

Delivery of benefits

Please liaise with the City's Coordinator, Recreation Services on **9400 4922** regarding the delivery of ALL benefits outlined in the contributions agreement.

You will need to ensure that you allow enough time for the City to coordinate any support that is required. The City's Coordinator, Recreation Services will provide you with guidance on these time frames.

NOTE: All communication regarding contribution agreements is to be through the City's Coordinator, Recreation Services.

Acquittal

All corporate contributions from the City require a full acquittal to be completed within two months of the agreement being completed.

Please complete all sections of the City's Corporate Contributions Acquittal Form.

For agreements where an acquittal is not possible, as determined by the City, the applicant should provide a report to the City outlining how they met the terms of the agreement within two months of the agreement being completed.

The City's Coordinator, Recreation Services will contact you with any queries regarding your acquittal.

If all acquittal information is satisfactory, you will receive a confirmation letter from the City finalising your contribution agreement.

Future contribution

Upon completion of a single year contribution agreement that does not include an option for renewal, the organisation must reapply to be considered for future contributions.

Please note that your organisation or program will not be funded on the basis that it was supported in previous years.

The City endeavours to ensure the corporate contributions process is fair and equitable to all. Your application will be assessed against the eligibility and criteria outlined previously in these guidelines and competition from other applications or existing corporate contribution agreements in the relevant financial year.

Please do not rely on the City providing funding on an ongoing basis.

Frequently Asked Questions



I'm unsure of which category to apply for. Who can I speak to discuss this?

The City's Marketing Coordinator is available to discuss your application and direct you as to which category best fits your event, program or activity. The City's Marketing Coordinator can be contacted on **9400 4424**.

How many times can I apply for funding from the City?

The City of Joondalup will only accept one funding application for each event, program or activity. If your organisation is considering holding two separate events within the region, only one event can be approved for funding.

Organisations cannot apply for funding through multiple funding programs at the City. Only one funding application will be considered per event/program.

How long will it take to assess my application?

The City endeavours to assess all sponsorship, contribution and donation applications within two months.

Larger applications that are required to be approved by the City of Joondalup Council, may take longer to assess. Any delays will be communicated to the applicant as soon as it is known.

My event was funded last year; do I need to submit another application for this year?

The City will assess applications on a case by case basis and funding is subject to sufficient funds being available in the City's annual budget.

Events that were sponsored in previous years will not be guaranteed funding in the current year. Applications are assessed against the eligibility and criteria listed within this application pack and competition from other applications.

Why do I have to complete the acquittal form?

The completion of the acquittal form signifies the completion of the sponsorship or contribution agreement.

The acquittal form has been introduced to ensure the agreement that has been signed by both parties has been delivered accordingly. It is in the best interests of the City and the applicant to ensure all agreed deliverables are completed within the agreement period.

I am interested in hosting a significant event in the City of Joondalup. Who can I contact to discuss this?

To assist the City in achieving its vision of becoming a bold, creative and prosperous City on the global stage, the City encourages organisations

to develop new significant events to be held within the City in order to broaden economic benefit for Joondalup and enhance the strategic community and tourism planning of the City.



Community Funding Program Guidelines





What is the Community Funding Program?

The City of Joondalup Community Funding Program is a small grants program that aims to assist community groups, not-for-profit organisations and schools in developing and enhancing the Joondalup community. Funding is available in the categories of Culture and the Arts Development, Environmental Development and Community Development.

Community funding is available to not-for-profit organisations, community organisations, community groups/clubs, companies limited by guarantee, schools and religious organisations. Unincorporated organisations or individuals may apply but must be supported by a sponsoring organisation.

Round One

Applications received after 5.00pm on the round closing date will not be considered. In order for your application to be assessed you must discuss your application with the appropriate Fund Administrator prior to submitting an application.

Failure to discuss your application prior to applying will exclude your application from funding.

Canvassing of Elected Members may disqualify your application.



Available funds

The Culture and the Arts Development and Environmental Development Funds each have \$25,000 (ex GST) allocated annually and the Community Development Fund has \$27,500 (ex GST) allocated annually. All funds are split across both rounds and between all successful candidates.

Culture and the Arts Development Fund

Objectives

- To extend and support the level of community participation in arts and cultural activities within the City.
- To increase the number and variety of arts and cultural activities available within the City.
- To positively contribute to the well-being of the artistic and cultural nature of the community.
- To support the development of arts and cultural groups within the City.
- To enhance the cultural fabric of the City.

Priorities

Events, projects or programs which:

- Encourage new partnerships and collaborations with other cultural and arts groups or individuals.
- Provide access to arts and cultural activity within the City to groups not previously engaged.
- Demonstrate sustainable and/or long-term artistic and cultural benefit for the City.
- Support community involvement in the City's existing cultural program.

Specific Criteria

- Small capital items are considered to be under \$2,000 in value.
- Projects which replicate services already provided by the City of Joondalup (e.g. community art exhibitions) are unlikely to be funded.

Community Development Fund

Objectives

To support community development initiatives that identify and address community needs, including to:

- Promote interactions between seniors and children or young people (inter-generational activities).
- Reduce the isolation of people who are “at-risk” or marginalised.
- Promote positive mental health and wellbeing outcomes.
- Promote positive behavioural changes, attitudinal changes and/or healthy life choices.
- Promote community leadership.
- Promote respect, celebrate difference and foster inclusion.

Priorities

To support community development initiatives that bring positive benefits to any one or more of the following groups:

- Children, young people, families, seniors.
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.
- People who are homeless, or at risk of homelessness.
- People with disability, their family and carers.

Environmental Development Fund

Objective

To build a community that takes ownership of its environment and actively supports its ongoing preservation and conservation.

Priorities

To support community environmental programs that:

- Reduce greenhouse gas emissions.
- Improve energy efficiency.
- Achieve water conservation outcomes.
- Result in waste minimisation or increased recycling.
- Protect and enhance the biodiversity of the City’s natural areas or increase local native biodiversity in other areas.
- Increase the use of sustainable transport such as walking, cycling or public transport.
- Raise community awareness and involvement in environmental initiatives.

Specific Criteria

- All projects require approval to work on City land and specific licences may also be required depending on the nature of the project.

Eligibility

Applicants must satisfy the below criteria:

- Be a not-for-profit organisation, community organisation, community group/club, company limited by guarantee, school and religious organisation. Unincorporated organisations or individuals may apply but must be supported by a sponsoring organisation.
- Offer a project, activity or service based in the City of Joondalup or which will primarily benefit Joondalup residents.
- Have completed and acquitted any project for which any City of Joondalup funding was previously received.
- Undertake the project or activity for the benefit of the wider community which could include:
- Small capital items (see specific criteria for your category).
- Seeding grants for projects, activities or events which can demonstrate independent viability after project acquittal.
- Projects which are additional to a school's regular curriculum.
- One-off projects, activities or events.
- Projects that align with the specific priorities and objectives of the fund they are applying.



Ineligibility

Grants will not be provided for/to:

- Fundraising projects.
- GST.
- Retrospective funding (ie. projects that have already commenced or been completed).
- Recurrent salaries and recurrent operational costs.
- Government agencies with the exception of schools.
- Deficient funding.
- Development or improvement of school facilities and equipment associated with the normal curriculum.
- For-profit organisations.
- Project activities which are ongoing or occur as part of the City's ordinary activities.
- Any applicant who has not previously acquitted a grant with the City.
- Organisations that have previously submitted, and been successful for financial support (inc. sponsorship, contribution, donation or funding) from the City within the same financial year for the same project, event or program.



Sponsoring arrangements

Non-incorporated organisations or individuals must have an appropriate sponsor organisation that can support their project and receive and manage the grant on their behalf. A sponsor organisation will be legally and financially responsible for the management of all aspects of the funded project, including:

- Receiving, banking and administration of grant funds.
- Monitoring of the project.
- Public Liability Insurance.
- Collection of evaluation information.
- Project completion and acquittal.

It is the responsibility of the applicant and the sponsor organisation to independently negotiate and agree upon the terms and conditions of the sponsoring agreement between them. The City of Joondalup will in no way be involved.

Applications

Speak to the relevant Fund Administrator to see if your program, project or event idea is eligible for funding and which fund would be most relevant for you to apply.

Complete an application online and submit it before **5.00pm on the closing date**. Online application forms are available on the City's website at joondalup.wa.gov.au

If you need assistance completing an online application, please contact the relevant Fund Administrator.

Applicants will be advised of the outcome of their application within three months of the closing date. Successful applications will be approved by the CEO on the recommendation of the appropriate assessment panel.



How are the applications assessed?

The following will be considered when assessing applications:

- Demonstration of community need and how the project will address this.
- Alignment to the priorities and objectives specific to the fund you are applying for.
- Demonstration that the broader community will be engaged, informed or involved in the project.
- Extent to which the applicant has made other attempts to seek funding, provided a co-contribution or in-kind support.
- Other financial support the applicant has received from the City in the same financial year (1 July to 30 June).
- If the program or service/s is already offered in the City of Joondalup and have partnership opportunities been considered.

Due to demand on the funds, not all candidates which meet the criteria may be successful in receiving funding. Projects will be prioritised according to greatest demonstrated benefits and which are most aligned with the priorities and objectives of the fund.

Conditions

All applicants must discuss their project with the relevant fund administrator prior to applying.

Applicants seeking funds through this program must agree to the terms and conditions outlined in Smartygrants prior to submitting their application.

Successful applicants may also be required to accept additional terms and conditions. These will be included as an attachment to an engagement letter in addition to the standard terms and conditions.

Successful applicants without an ABN or ACN must be prepared to complete a Statement by a Supplier form in order to be funded. If no ABN, ACN or signed Statement by a Supplier form is provided, the City is required to withhold 46.5% of grant payments made, to be paid over to the Australian Tax Office (ATO).

It is a requirement that an acquittal of funds, including receipts or tax invoices, together with a report outlining the success of the project in meeting its objectives, is provided within six weeks of completion of the project, activity or event. Any unspent funds or funds not accounted for must be returned to the City. If you require an extension to expend your funds past the date stated in your application, you can contact the Fund Administrator to discuss arrangements.

Applicants should acknowledge the City, through means such as advertising, promotion and any media publicity associated with any project, activity or event. Approval must be given to use the City's logo where appropriate. The acknowledgements must be included as part of the acquittal of funds.

Applicants may submit more than one Community Funding application per financial year but only one Community Funding application per organisation will be funded. Applicants wishing to submit more than one application should prioritise their applications.

The City is unable to fund GST, the GST component of any expenditure is the responsibility of the applicant.



Frequently asked questions

Does fundraising mean raising funds for other activities, or does it include funds raised by the project for its own sustainability?

The City will not contribute to any form of fundraising. Therefore, if your activity involves collecting donations, or profiting funds it is not eligible. Revenue raising for cost recovery of the event (eg. ticket sales to your event) is acceptable.

Does an applicant need to enter into a contract or agreement if successful in funding?

Yes. Applicants seeking funds through this program must agree to the funding terms and conditions.

Does an applicant need an ABN or ACN to receive funding?

No. Successful applicants without an ABN or ACN can complete a Statement by a Supplier. If no ABN, ACN or signed Statement by a Supplier form is provided, the City is required to withhold 46.5% of grant payments made, to be paid over to the Australian Tax Office (ATO).

Will an applicant need to acquit the funds after the program is complete?

Yes. Successful applicants will need to complete a short report and outline the success of the project in meeting its objectives. Tax invoices are to be provided to confirm expenditure of the funds and any promotional materials acknowledging the City's contribution. This is to be submitted via Smartygrants within six weeks of completing the project, activity or event. Any unspent funds or funds not accounted for must be returned to the City.

Can there be an extension on the funding period?

Yes. By negotiation. If you require an extension to expend your funds past the date stated in your application you can contact the Fund Administrator to discuss arrangements.

Does the City need to be publicly thanked for the funding received?

Applicants should acknowledge the City, through means such as advertising, promotion and any media publicity associated with any project, activity or event. Approval must be given to use the City's logo where appropriate.



Must applicants liaise with the City's Fund Administrators?

Yes. Applicants must contact the City's Fund Administrators to discuss their project idea. Failure to discuss your application prior to applying will exclude your application from funding.

If an organisation's office is not located in the City of Joondalup, are they still eligible?

Yes if over 50% of your membership are City residents, or if the project, activity, or event is carried out within the City's boundaries or will primarily benefit City residents.

Does a group need to be incorporated to be eligible for Funding?

No, your group does not have to be incorporated, but you will need to apply through an incorporated group under a sponsor arrangement.

Can an applicant use Community Funding to buy equipment?

Capital items, including equipment are eligible for funding but the amount granted for these items may be capped. Community initiatives, programs, activities and events may be prioritised for funding over capital items and equipment.

Should the budget include GST in the budget and quote?

No. The City cannot fund GST. The cost of GST is the responsibility of the applicant.

Can multiple grants be applied for?

Only one Community Funding application per group will be funded in any financial year. Therefore, it is best to be selective and apply for the grant that will benefit your group the most. Organisations that have previously submitted and been successful for other financial support from the City (eg. sponsorship, contribution, donation or other funding) from the City within the same financial year for the same project, event or program cannot be funded.

Other financial support the applicant has received from the City in the same financial year does not preclude you from applying but may be considered when your application is being assessed.



Cultural Sites

Luisini Winery

Lakeway Drive, Kingsley

Private **(P)**

The Luisini Winery site consists of the surviving 1929 concrete block with corrugated galvanised roof, winery building, other structures and features associated with the former operation of the winery, together with the remaining introduced vegetation, natural vegetation and landscape. The site is a listed heritage site and is managed by the National Trust.



Duffy House

108 Duffy Terrace, Woodvale

City of Joondalup Venue **(J)**

Also known colloquially as 'Frederick Duffy House' or 'Jack Duffy House', this site located in Woodvale, comprising a single storey iron, brick and limestone Cottage (1911-1913), and a ruinous limestone Dairy Building (1925) sits in an open rural setting between Beenyp Swamp and Lake Goollelal.

It has cultural heritage significance because it is representative of the development of the market gardening and dairying industries in Western Australia in the early 20th century and it retains much of its original open wetland setting within Yellagonga Regional Park. This is becoming less common in Western Australia due to increased urbanisation.



Galaxy Drive-In

The Galaxy Drive-In is the only place in metropolitan Perth that you can still enjoy a retro drive-in experience with family.



Edith Cowan University – Sculpture Park

Peter Cowan Writers Centre

Edith Cowan House

Now in its 22nd year, the Peter Cowan Writers Centre provides support and development for emerging and established creative writers within the northern suburbs of Perth. It has continued to grow and offer a range of writing opportunities for its membership and the wider writing community.

Nestled in the Pines near the lake, the house was transported to the 'heart' of the Joondalup campus in 1997, and refurbished in late 2019. Members and visitors can explore the Peter Cowan Library Collection located within.



**Edith Cowan University –



Exhibition Locations

Many local art groups use local City-owned Community Facilities for their annual exhibitions or fetes to sell artwork. There are 35 venues available for hire throughout the City, providing a large choice for exhibitions or art events. The facilities range in size and functionality from small meeting rooms to large halls capable of catering for up to 300 people, and range in price from \$22.00 to \$58.00 per hour dependant on the facility of choice.




