At its meeting held on 16 February 2021 (CJ006-02/21 refers) Council endorsed a review of the City's <i>Local Government and Public Property Local Law 2014</i> to consider possible amendments to the local law provisions around the permissibility of temporary advertising signs in thoroughfares and road verges. A local law amendment will be submitted to future Council to consider detailing any possible changes that can be made.</p> <p><b><u>Update as at November 2020</u></b> A new draft policy was presented to Council at its meeting held on 20 October 2020 (CJ162-10/20 refers). Yellagonga Regional Park is under the care, maintenance, and management of the Department.</p> <p>The Department are directly responsible for the waste and litter generated within the Regional Park. The Department has installed one litter bin on the Wanneroo side of the Park to cater for that side.</p> <p>The City has liaised with the relevant officer at the Department in an effort to resolve concerns raised regarding waste and litter within the park and has offered to provide and install bins and collect the waste deposited in these bins on behalf of the Department if they wish to engage the City to do so. It is estimated that the cost to the Department would be approximately \$3,500 per bin per year.
