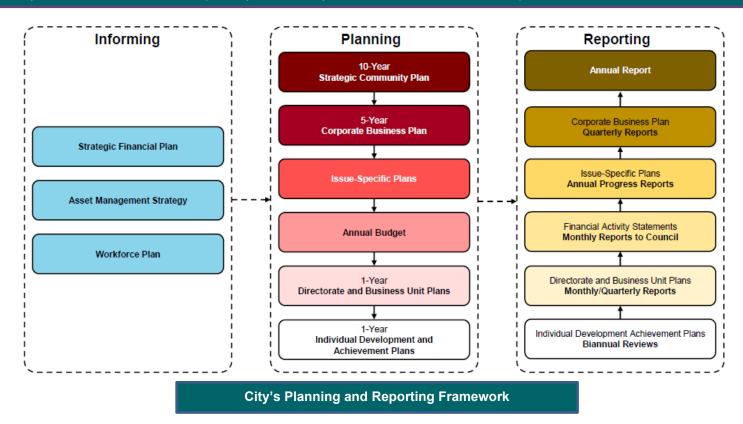

### How do we report performance against the Corporate Business Plan?





The City's **Planning and Reporting Framework** (previous page) requires the development of performance reports against all major plans.

#### **Corporate Business Plan Reports**

Quarterly progress reports are presented to Council on all projects and programs in the *Corporate Business Plan*.

The reports provide information on achievements and performance against the quarterly milestones set at the beginning of the year and indicates whether the project or program is *on time* and *on budget* at the end of each quarter and at the end of the year. A commentary is also provided each quarter on exactly what has been achieved.

Quarterly Reports on progress are published on the City's website at Corporate Business Plan and Quarterly Reports – City of Joondalup

#### **Annual Report**

The City's Annual Report outlines the status of all *Corporate Business Plan* projects and programs at the end of each year and also states why a project or program has not been completed or is not on track. The Annual Report also documents the number of projects and programs completed within the *Corporate Business Plan*.

The City's Annual Report also includes *Global Reporting Initiative (GRI) Standard*. The GRI Standard is a best practice sustainability reporting framework which establishes guidelines, principles and performance indicators for organisations to measure and report on their impacts on the economy, environment, social and governance performance.

The results of customer satisfaction surveys on a range of City services and programs are reported in the Annual Report.

### **Our Services**

Local government is responsible for delivery of a wide range of economic, human, recreational and property services as well as developing and maintaining essential community infrastructure.

Local government has the responsibility to perform many functions for the local community which are statutory services. Examples include approvals for planning, building and health, and swimming pool security fencing.

Local government also delivers discretionary services to the community such as library programs, events, leisure centres and the provision of recreational facilities and programs which contribute to an improved quality of life for people within the community.

Internal services, such as human resources and IT, provide the capacity for local governments to deliver external services to the community.

**Governance and Leadership** 

#### City of Joondalup Annual Report

The 2019/20 City of Joondalup Annual Report was endorsed by Council at a special meeting held on 22 December 2020. The Annual Report is an essential tool which informs the community and key stakeholders about achievements, challenges and future plans in line with Section 5.53 of the *Local Government Act 1995*. The Annual Report demonstrates the City's performance against the long-term vision of the *Strategic Community Plan: Joondalup 2022*, and the projects and priorities detailed within the *City's Corporate Business Plan*.

The Annual Report provides information about the City's organisational performance while promoting greater community awareness of the City's programs and services which contribute to a high quality of life for residents, visitors and stakeholders. The Annual Report also illustrates the City's commitment to accountable and transparent government.

The 2019/20 Annual Report will be received at the Annual General Meeting of Electors to be held on 2 February 2021.

#### Strategic Position Statement - Cyber Security

Council, at its meeting of 8 December 2020, endorsed the addition of a new Strategic Position Statement relating to Cyber Security. The position statement provides direction on how the City aims to strengthen its position as the home to cyber security and the first ever Innovation Hub in Western Australia. The endorsement of this additional statement aligns with the City's strategic objective of Strong Leadership.

#### **New Development Standards for Housing Opportunity Areas**

In December 2020, Planning Minister Rita Saffioti approved a scheme amendment which introduced a set of new development standards to guide infill development within the City of Joondalup's 10 Housing Opportunity Areas (HOAs).

The standards brought into effect certain provisions within the HOAs such as restricting the number of multiple dwellings that can be built on approximately 50 percent of residential blocks currently coded R20/R40, minimum frontage widths and increased requirements to help protect the impact of overshadowing on existing neighbouring properties.

### **Economic Prosperity, Vibrancy and Growth**

#### Business Forum: Destination Joondalup – Growing the Visitor Economy

The City launched its *Destination City Plan*, 'Destination Joondalup' at the third and final Business Forum for 2020 held at Joondalup Resort on 5 November 2020. Destination Joondalup aims to stimulate Joondalup's visitor economy, elevate Joondalup's profile as a destination of choice, and enhance visitor experiences to attract more leisure, education and commercial visitors to Joondalup.

WA Minister for Tourism and Small Business, Hon Paul Papalia CSC MLA, addressed the Forum and took part in a panel discussion alongside Dr Amanda Ling, Joondalup Health Campus Interim CEO, Professor Simon Ridings, ECU Vice Chancellor International, and Evan Hall, CEO Tourism Council of WA. The panel discussed the contribution of the Joondalup small business community in dealing with COVID-19 and the opportunities for local businesses to create a thriving, resilient visitor economy into the future.

The Business Forum was attended by approximately 200 participants.

### WA AustCyber Innovation Hub

A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the City, Edith Cowan University and the WA AustCyber Innovation Hub was formalised during the quarter. The MOU provides for continued exchange and collaboration to expand cyber security activities within the City for the next two years, and supports innovation and creativity within the Joondalup business community.

#### Think Green Environmental Education Program

A successful native bee hotel workshop, entitled 'All Abuzz about Native Bees' was delivered to community members on 7 November 2020 as part of the Think Green Environment Education Program. A total of 21 community members learnt about the different species of native bees, their habits, where they can be found, how to identify native bees, the threats they face, and how to make gardens more native bee friendly.

BirdLife WA delivered two workshops in October 2020 supported by the City as part of the 'Connecting Urban Communities with Nature' project. The workshops and provided information about creating bird friendly, low water, low maintenance gardens using locally native species that can be used in gardens, patios and on balconies. The workshops were attended by 55 participants, with most being City residents.

#### State of the Environment Report

A City of Joondalup State of the Environment Report 2019/20 was developed in December 2020. The report describes the key initiatives undertaken in 2019/20 to protect and enhance the City's natural environment and provides a snapshot of progress made in implementing key actions and initiatives from within the City's Environment Plan 2014-2019.

Detailed annual reviews against the implementation of each of the City's 17 environment plans were completed to inform the State of the Environment Report. The report provides progress made in 2019/20 under the themes of:

- Biodiversity;
- Water;
- Climate Change;
- Waste; and
- Community Involvement.

#### **Invitation Art Prize**

The 2020 Invitation Art Prize took place at Westfield Whitford Shopping City from 11 to 25 October 2020. The exhibition included 30 works by prominent Western Australian artists working in a broad range of mediums.

The overall winner was Elham Eshraghian-Haakansson for her video installation titled 'face to face'. The installation was acquired by the City of Joondalup Art Collection.

#### **RYDE Program Launch**

The City launched its Regional Youth Driver Education (RYDE) program in December 2020. The program offers accessible and supervised driving opportunities to young people aged between 16 and 25 to assist in completing their 50 hours of supervised driving before receiving their provisional driver's licence.

#### The Natural Environment

### **Community Wellbeing**

In 2020, Council approved \$15,000 towards the purchase of a suitable car for the program and have it fitted with extra driver pedals. The City also received a \$7,500 Federal Government grant towards funding of the program. The RYDE Program will assist disadvantaged young people to get their driver's licence, providing greater access to employment, training and leisure activities.

#### **Reconciliation Action Plan**

The Reconciliation Action Plan Community Reference Group held its first two meetings in November and December 2020. Noongar Yamatji woman, Sharon Wood-Kenney, was appointed the inaugural chairwoman for the community reference group. The group will provide guidance in the development of the City's Reconciliation Action Plan to improve relationships with Aboriginal people and relevant stakeholders, as well as fostering a better understanding of Aboriginal cultures, rights and experiences.

#### **Little Feet Festival**

The Little Feet Festival was held on 25 October 2020 at Edith Cowan University with 3,500 people attending. The Festival is the region's premier event for children under the age of 12 and included a range of family-friendly activities related to the theme of "3,2,1 Blast Off".

Participants were taken on a journey to outer space, exploring the wonders of the solar system and its planets through hands-on activities, engaging educational performances and creative play making aliens, space creatures, rockets and flying saucers.

One of the key attractions was the St Stephen's School Exploration Station, presented by Scitech, where children could put their engineering skills to the test in building a robot on the surface of another planet.

This was the City's first large-scale outdoor event delivered by the City since COVID-19 restrictions were put in place in early 2020 and careful planning went into ensuring the festival complied with State Government directions in relation to COVID-19.
