It is expected to proceed to the Policy Committee in May 2023.</p> <p><u>Update as at November 2022</u> As stated below, a revised Local Government and Public Property Local Law (incorporating the changes on signage) is expected to be presented to the Policy Committee in February 2023.</p> <p><u>Update as at August 2022</u> The Amendment Local Law was presented to Council on 16 August 2022.
